I left Cuernavaca on December 12, driving 23 hours north to Houston with another missionary. From Houston, Texas, I flew to Chicago for my yearly medical and dental consultations. Praise the Lord, I do not have any major infection! What a change from the last four years!

I cannot help but praise the Lord for how He took care of us during the 23 hour drive! We were stopped four times for military checks and once for an agricultural check. There was one military stop where two military guys practically opened all the suitcases and turned over every item we had in the SUV. One guy kept asking me why the right back door wouldn't open. I gave him the same answer every time he asked, "Ask her (the other missionary). It is her car. This is not my car. I do not know why the back door won't open." He asked me three times and I gave him the same answer each time. What puzzled me was... he never asked the other missionary on why her right back door wouldn't open. Oh well... that is Mexico! There are many things, people and situations that I find myself in that I have no explanation for. I simply accept these things just as they are, knowing that I am not there to change their cultural, social, traditional or political views. I know my job is to share the gospel to as many people as possible and disciple those women who demonstrate great spiritual interest, faithfulness, teachability and availability. It is the Holy Spirit who changes their lives. My other job is to teach the Word of God. The Word of God is truth. Truth sets men, women and children free! (John 8:32).

I praise the Lord for a fruitful fall 09 ministry season! He gave me six women who came faithfully every Tuesday evening showing great interest in learning how to read & study their Bible, how to memorize scripture memory verses, how to serve in the church and how to share their faith.
