This gave her the interest to attend my weekly Bible study. On the very first Tuesday that she came, I presented the Bridge salvation illustration. She repeated the sinner's prayer after me in front of all the regular ladies that attend. Her hunger for God's Word was very evident from that evening on. She recently attended our church for the first time on December 11 – three months after receiving Christ as her Savior! Praise God!

- 4. My missionary circle. In January 2011, the Lord gave me the privilege to start a women's missionary circle. Five missionaries meet regularly to pray and encourage each other, which has been a great blessing and encouragement to me! Praise God!
- 5. My Bible storytelling class in Puebla. In October 2011, I started the class on Bible storytelling at Puebla Biblical Seminary. Statistics show that up to 70% of Latin Americans are oral-visual learners. This class helped me understand why many women do not complete our Bible study lessons. I am enjoying the class tremendously and started using the principles I am learning in my weekly Bible studies. I have seen a greater amount of participation as a result of the Bible stories. Praise God!

Here are my "thumbs down" events:

- 1. In April 2011, I witnessed the horrible medical management of a patient who had surgery. The patient died. I was in shock for a few weeks and had to grapple with the reality of how poor people are treated. It was a very low point in my life. For a few weeks, I was dragging myself to lead Bible studies and prayer meetings knowing it was the right thing to do. Praise God, He lifted me up from my pit!
- 2. In September 2011, I had to ask one gal to leave my group. It was a very difficult thing to do because I had to exercise my authority to protect the rest of the ladies in the group. This gal consistently showed disrespect and lack of interest

- in the Bible studies. She would paint her nails during our prayer meetings and would be gone for a long time during the Bible study, which left me wondering why she came. I consulted my team leader, who advised me to give this gal the option to join another group. I did what I was told to do. Whew!!!
- 3. In November 2011, my 17-year-old car started leaking oil and transmission fluid and I was without a car for three weeks. The car was moving from one repair shop to another, because I did not know which mechanic to believe. The third mechanic said he replaced the steering box. I thought it would be ok then, but it continued to leak oil and transmission fluid. I decided to just let it leak, because I don't want to spend any more money on repairs. Right now, before driving the car, I just check both the oil and transmission fluid. If the levels are low, I add what it needs. I carry a liter each of oil and transmission fluid in my trunk. - 4. One of the faithful ladies, G, in my Bible study group was diagnosed with cancer. G. has been part of my group for the last two years. It is devastating to see her lose her hair because of chemotherapy. I get close to these ladies, and when they suffer, I too suffer. Would you pray for God to heal her?
